Cascade Hosts Virtual Lake Tapps Community Meeting, June 24

Lake Tapps WA – Cascade Water Alliance invites the public to join a virtual Lake Tapps community meeting on Thursday, June 24, 6-8 pm, to learn more about how everyone can help keep Lake Tapps Reservoir clean, healthy, and safe. The community meeting is free and open to all, but registration is required.

Lake Tapps is a recreational gem of the region, especially for the homeowners who live along its shore. But it's also a working reservoir owned and operated to eventually provide municipal drinking water to members of the Cascade Water Alliance. Keeping Lake Tapps clean and healthy is up to everyone who enjoys the lake today and into the future.

At the community meeting on June 24th, neighbors will learn more about what's happening at Lake Tapps. Cascade staff and representatives from our partner agencies around the lake – City of Bonney Lake, Pierce County, East Pierce Fire and Rescue, Tacoma Pierce County Health Department, and Washington State Fish and Wildlife – will be on hand to talk about projects, operations, provide information about ways to keep Lake Tapps clean and safe, and answer questions. Learn more about SwimSafe, TappsWise natural yard care, the Lake Tapps incident locator program, milfoil and more.

Cascade purchased the 100-plus year old White River system and Lake Tapps Reservoir from Puget Sound Energy in 2009. Since then, Cascade has invested tens of millions of dollars to keep the reservoir infrastructure reliable and the waters healthy.
