What is "Sustainable Gardening" anyway?

KNOW YOUR GARDEN

- ✓ "Aspect" My yard slopes towards the _____ (south, north, east, west)
- ✓ Temperature range is from _____ (this winter) to _____ (last summer) --- YIKES!!!

✓ Sun / Partial Sun / Shade

- What are the variations within my yard? And what am I trying to grow in each?
- How does it change between winter and summer?
- What creates the shade?

✓ Rainwater

- Does it soak into my soil or run off?
- Are there areas of ponding (especially in heavy rain or in winter)?
- How fast does water soak in?
- ✓ Soil Moisture without adding water, is it naturally...
 - Wet in winter, dry in summer?
 - Moist, wet, or saturated?
 - Well-draining throughout the year?

BUILD HEALTHY SOIL . . .

- ✓ **Protect it:** prevent compaction; add organic material; cover bare soil
- ✓ Add Compost
 - BEFORE planting large, unplanted area mix up to 4" of compost into soil
 - NOT within individual planting holes
- ✓ Cover it (Mulch) –areas with existing plants ... weed-less, water-less gardening
 - Woody plants...woodchips (3-4") www.chipdrop.com, leaves (2-3"), compost (1-2")
 - annuals and perennialsleaves (2-3") or compost (1-2")

RIGHT PLANT / RIGHT PLACE

- ✓ Conserve existing native plants
- ✓ Match plants' needs to your site sun / shade, moisture need, winter hardiness
- ✓ Select pest- and disease-resistant varieties
- ✓ Visually pleasing "Rule of Thirds" (1/3rd evergreen, 1/3rd deciduous, 1/3rd ephemeral)

WATER . . .

- ✓ Let rain soak in

START PLANTS RIGHT

- 1. Water plants before they are planted
- 2. Plant Right

Dig wide, rough-sided hole . . . only as deep as plant's root ball

Loosen & spread roots

Position to keep the root flare exposed (top of root ball <u>slightly above</u> the soil) **Use the native soil** (no peat moss, compost, or anything else)

- 3. Mulch
- 4. Water Deeply

HEALTHY . . . for PEOPLE, PETS & WILDLIFE

1. Start with prevention
