Establishing Plants to Withstand Summer's Dry Season

Step 1 – Understand Your Garden's *Non-Living Matter* (Sand / Silt / Clay)

- a.k.a. "soil texture" or "soil type"... indicator of the soil's natural drainage rate
- Formed over millennia; you cannot change it

Methods:

- "soil shake jar test" (online videos)
- "ribbon test" (online videos)

Step 2 – Improve Your Soil's Structure (*Living Matter*) ... timing matters

- Improves water holding capacity and drainage
- Releases nutrients for plants
- Easier for roots to grow into

Method ...

- If no roots are present
 - TIMING: when the soil is moist but not soggy
 - dig in 2 to 4 inches of compost throughout the soil to a depth of 6 to 10 inches, and then cover entire soil with mulch
- If the area already has roots growing there
 - TIMING: before the summer's dry season when the soil is moist
 - simply cover the soil with mulch...

Planting Area	Mulch to Use (depth m	atters)
shrubs, trees	Woodchips* (3 to 4")	Leaves (2 to 3")
ferns, perennials, bulbs	Leaves (2 to 3")	Coarse compost (1 to 2")
vegetables	Straw (1 to 1.5")	Coarse compost (1 to 1.5")

Step 3 – Choose Plants that THRIVE in Your Soil and are drought tolerant once established

Step 4 –Plant Right ... waiting until fall rains begin

Method:

- 1. Find the root flare ... and keep it exposed above ground
- 2. Tussle the roots
- 3. Use your native soil
- 4. Apply mulch (keep it 1 to 2" from plant's stem)
- 5. Water deeply

Step 5- Practice Smart Watering

Methods:

- Water Deeply, and less frequently
 - 1" of water per week ... vegetables, lawns (to stay green)
 - 1" of water per month ... "golden" lawns (dormant)
- Make every drop count
 - Soaker hose
 - Drip system
 - Quick-disconnect couplers
 - Straight-sided cans to measure water depth
 - Irrigation audit
